Community Resilience

"Community resilience" may be a term unfamiliar to readers of this newsletter. Many may be more familiar with terms like "contingency planning" or simply "being prepared". Community resilience is a government initiative which is these ideas and more, as it implies an element of "looking out for others" in times of need.


Examples might be planning for periods of extreme weather: severe cold, gales or conversely, a heat wave. Another recent example would be pandemic influenza. Government and local government have responsibility to plan for such events, and others. In the past individuals and communities made their own preparations for difficult times and community resilience embraces this. Consider how you might prepare for the unexpected? A few simple steps such as keeping in stock a small extra contingency store of dry goods/tinned foodstuffs, a few basic home remedies such as you might take on a holiday abroad, and provision of an alternative means of preparing meals/ heating a single room will be seen by many, as simply common sense.

Smaller communities like Plumley, Bexton and Toft, have a tradition of "keeping an eye out for" those at risk in their neighbourhoods such as elderly or infirm residents. More formal plans for bigger threats to the community, requiring a more robust response, will be prepared by the parish council with Cheshire East and will be available to view on the website. <p>Police in Knutsford are warning motorists to protect their belongings by locking their vehicles; this is in response to a recent increase in thefts from unattended cars and vans in Knutsford and the surrounding rural areas.</p> <p>The advice from police is to remove any items of high value from the vehicle or at least move them out of sight and also to lock vehicles.</p> <p>Sergeant Alex McMillan from the local Policing Team said "Rural parking areas and residential locations with little or no lighting appear to be the areas most heavily targeted by thieves, the most attractive items are hand held electronic devices such as laptops and smart phones".</p> <p>Top items wanted by thieves are portable computing devices such as tablet PCs and laptops; smart phones; cash and jewellery.</p> <p>Police have increased patrols in the areas most affected by this recent increase in thefts and will work with partner agencies in an effort to reduce the number of victims of this type of criminality.</p>
