HS2 - High Speed Rail

Plumley village is vulnerable; although the line of the preferred route bypasses the village the engineering options show an alternative route that passes along the western side of the village, crossing Plumley Moor Road at Henshaw Green Farm. Any geological problems that affect the line of the preferred route, and there are many possible problems throughout Cheshire and especially within our locality, could see the line of the route moved closer to the village.

We need to fight this proposal.

A number of residents, from various communities in Cheshire, have set up an action group (Mid Cheshire Against HS2), do we need it, do we want it, what is the business case for it, how will it affect the environment? These and many other questions have yet to be satisfactorily answered.

Local lads who gave their lives during The Great War

With the centenary of the Great War fast approaching I feel it only right to highlight a local lad who gave his life during that awful conflict.

George Whittaker, born 1888, an unmarried schoolteacher who joined the 6th Batt Manchester's and was sent to Gallipoli. He was a prolific letter writer and a picture of him can be found in the Knutsford Guardian.

The thatched cottage he left in 1915 still stands in Nether Tabley.

His parents were told he was missing in action on the 15th June 1915 attacking at Krithia but it wasn't until Jan 1916 John and Mary Whittaker were informed that he had been killed on that day; his body discovered by another regiment and had been buried where he fell – his grave long since lost. The letter they received stated that his effects were in too poor a condition to be returned.

He is remembered on The Hellas Memorial, Gallipoli together with 21,000 Empire other soldiers.

In Review

The Other Theatre Company's production of Quartet, at PVH in April, was a brave choice by director Sophia Kennedy considering the recent film release. TOTC gave us the original play, nominated for an Olivier award in 2000, with four characters whilst the film had a much larger cast.

The play is set in a home for retired opera singers and we meet Wilf (Roger Barlow) who is chiefly pre-occupied with sex, which is clearly wishful thinking, Cissie (Margaret Leslie) who is slightly batty and has a fixation that everyone has recently arrived from Karachi and Reggie (Harry Kennedy) whose philosophy on life is that 'Art is meaningless if it does not make you feel'.

The tenor of their days is shattered by the arrival of Jean (Rebecca Taylor) who is simply distraught at having to be in a home at all, but particularly one which has 'chorus singers and orchestral players in abundance but few virtuosos'. We also learn that Jean was once married to Reggie; although she has been married several times since to a list of artists known to them all. Reggie's distress at Jean's arrival is typified by his comment that 'old age helps you forget that which should be forgotten'.

Essentially, the play is a hymn to human frailty. The characters think of themselves as an exclusive club and each finds it difficult to accept that their talents have largely deserted them. They believe themselves to be trapped in the home but in reality they are trapped by their own senility with only the annual concert to celebrate Giuseppe Verdi's birthday to set them free.

During Act II, Reggie, Wilf and Cissie try to persuade Jean to make up a foursome to sing the 'Quartet' from Rigoletto on 10 October, Verdi's birthday. They believe that this will provide a purpose to their lives which will help them face the future. Jean displays great distress and finally owns up to the fact that she hasn't sung for thirty years and what's worse, the last time she attempted to sing no notes came out!

So they decide to do the unthinkable and the play ends with a virtuoso performance of the Quartet from Rigoletto – yes really!

Most of the play was performed in the round but the use of the stage for the operatic performance provided an excellent finale. The characters were well cast and portrayed their human frailties sympathetically. The poignancy of people who had once been famous but who had aged so quickly they didn't have time to change was evident throughout the performance. Inspired direction from Sophia Kennedy!

Quartet was another excellent production by TOTC which is to be congratulated on the diversity of works which make up its distinguished repertoire.

At One with Nature

As it seems that Spring has finally sprung, we take a look at what we should be doing to support our Cheshire wildlife and get our gardens to grow.

Now is a fantastic time to lay turf or sew grass before the warmer weather – this will give it a chance to settle and root whilst taking advantage of those April-May showers! Daffodils have adorned our Plumley borders of late, and their foliage should be left in tact until at least 6 weeks after they finish flowering before pruning back for next year. Potatoes, shallots and onions can all be planted.

Unfortunately, the extensive winter may have had adverse effects on some of our local wildlife. It has been reported that hedgehogs may be suffering from a lack of food on awaking from hibernation, so placing a small dish of dog or cat food (although no fish varieties) alongside some water will encourage them into your garden and help give them a boost for the Spring season.

<p>Curzon Culture at Cut Price!</p> <p>Last month, local residents won the battle to dissuade Knutsford's Curzon cinema from its controversial proposal to increase ticket prices to almost £10 each at peak times. Following significant written complaints to the Knutsford Guardian (including from several Plumley residents!), Curzon has now reversed on this decision. Ticket prices will still be raised from April onwards to a rate of £8.50 (at peak times), but this remains significantly lower than the £9.75 initially proposed.</p> <p>It is a positive move on Curzon's behalf, to be seen to listen to and respond to its audience.
