## Parish Council News

### Parish Council Meetings

The next meeting of the Parish Council (PC) will be held on Wed 25th June at 8.00pm in Toft Church Hall. Members of the press and public are encouraged to attend meetings and there is a 15 minute period at the beginning of the meeting where members of the public are able to speak.

A police surgery is held prior to the PC meetings. On the 25th June at 7.45pm (TCH).

### Annual Meeting of the Parish Council

The annual meeting is when the Chairman and Vice-Chairman are elected by the members of the Parish Council. The meeting was held on 28th May at Toft Church Hall. This year Cllr Tony Gabbott was nominated for the role of Chairman, and the members of the Parish Council voted unanimously in favour of his appointment to the role.

There was also a unanimous vote for Cllr Chris Wilson to take on the role of Vice Chairman.

Tony and his wife Paula have lived in Plumley for 17 years, with their children David,

Jessica, Michael & Andrew. By profession Tony is a Certified Financial Planner with Tatton Financial Planning and is an active member of UgandAid, a charity sponsoring students at the Nile Vocational Institute. Tony and the team visit the institute every year to meet students and work on community projects.

Over the past few years Tony has been instrumental in bringing the plans for Plumley Station makeover to fruition, and in 2013 this led to Plumley Station being awarded the top prize for Best Kept Station.

The new Chairman asked the Clerk to minute his thanks to the outgoing Chairman, Cllr Sybil Crossman, for her hard work and dedication over the past 17 years in which she held the role.

### Casual Vacancies

Sadly two of our councillors, Jane Richardson and May Taylor have recently resigned, leaving two vacancies on the Parish Council, for Plumley ward. The statutory notices were placed on the Parish Notice boards and as an election was not requested by ten residents these vacancies will be filled by co-option for the period from now until the elections next year.

Anyone from Plumley wishing

to apply to become a Parish Councillor should send a short resume, to include what contribution they could make to the community as a Parish Councillor to the Clerk by 19th June. All applicants will be considered by the members of the Parish Council and those deemed most suitable will be put to the vote at the next PC meeting on 25th June 2014.

### Neville Baker

The members of the Parish Council were saddened to hear of the passing of Neville Baker who did so much for the village in the 56 years he lived here. He was a hardworking Parish Councillor who spoke his mind and made a significant contribution to the Parish Council and community. Cllr Sybil Crossman remarked that "Neville was a marvellous Vice Chairman, and I had the deepest respect for him". The members of the Parish Council wish to express their deepest sympathy to his widow, Barbara, and his family.

They're some of the last spring migrants to arrive, but the first to leave. They are currently listed as birds of Conservation Concern as numbers have declined dramatically over the past 10 years. The RSPB are asking us to let them know where swifts are seen and where they're nesting so that more nest sites can be provided and protected. Look out for low-level screaming groups of swifts (that means</p>	<p>they're breeding nearby) or where you've seen swifts nesting - perhaps entering a roof or hole in a building (if you can see the nest, it's not a swift). The best time to look is around dusk on a warm, still evening, or early morning. The position is home-based, working an average of 8.5 hours per week to provide legal (statutory requirements for parish councils), administrative and managerial support to the Parish Council. The Parish Council meets on the last Wednesday of every month with the exception of August and December. The Clerk is required to attend Parish Council meetings, and will also be the Responsible Financial Officer for the Parish Council.</p> <p>The successful candidate will be a good communicator; have relevant secretarial, office &amp; computer skills; internet access; own transport and be familiar with the production of basic accounts.
