Parish Council News - Housing Needs Survey Summary

On behalf of the Parish council I would like to thank everybody who took the time to complete and return the Housing Needs Survey questionnaire. The results have now been discussed with Cheshire East Council's (CEC) planning department and the conclusion agreed. The main points can be summarised as follows.

The quality of the survey was highly commended by CEC in terms of its ease to understand and the relevance of the information it gathered. CEC confirmed it was the best example they have seen of this type of survey and asked for permission from the Parish Council to allow other parishes to use it.

The response rate was 26% and slightly lower than CEC would normally expect. This was interpreted as an indication that the issue was not relevant to many households in the Parish. CEC confirmed that a response rate at this level in no way invalidated the results.

The overall need for affordable housing within the Parish was shown to be very small. Even where a possible need was recorded, available household income was shown to be insufficient to meet the need in all but one instance.

Additional Social Housing may be a further option, but the number of properties required is so small that such a development would not be practical.

The level of need demonstrated does not constitute a community need that the Parish Council would be expected or be able to try and resolve. The only course of action would be to repeat the survey in 5 years' time to assess any changes.

CEC planning dept. will now advise anybody considering the submission of plans for affordable housing within the parish that the level of need has been shown to be extremely small. I would also like to thank Cheshire Community Action (CCA) for distributing the survey and correlating all the results with great efficiency and cost effectiveness.

Winter Wildlife Haven

The Wildlife Trusts offers their top 5 tips on giving wildlife a helping hand in winter:

Keep your grass long – it provides shelter for insects, small mammals and amphibians

Keep a log pile – it provides a safe home for insects over the winter months

Retain a pile of fallen leaves – toads and newts seek out leaf litter and some creatures use leaves to line their nests or burrows

Let your ivy flower – this can provide nectar to insects like butterflies and bumblebees that fly on warmer winter days and as the berries ripen they provide food for birds

Provide a hibernating spot for hedgehogs - leaning plywood against a fence, wall or hedge in a quiet spot and covering it with leaves and branches will provide a snug spot.

Music on the Trains

National Awards

Much to our surprise the Mid Cheshire Community Rail Partnership was Overall Winner in the National Community Rail Awards at the beginning of October. This is a title that has generally been given in the past to a rail company, so all involved in the Line feel very honoured. It is a particular success for our Community Rail Officer, Sally Buttifant, who also received a personal award (jointly with Theatre in the Quarter) for 'Over by Christmas' in the category for First World War commemoration events. The Community Rail Partnership, with the students of Pettypool College, won the Involving Young People award for relandscaping Delamere station. And Ellesmere Port station partners won the award for Most Enhanced Station Buildings. Though Ellesmere Port is not on the Mid Cheshire Line, the renovation was co-ordinated by Sally using the community-based approach she had developed on the Line.

Music Trains

The 2015 season ended with a typically lively performance from the Deportees on 7 October on the Music Train from Chester to Plumley. And the week before we ran the fifth Music Train of 2015 from Altrincham to Chester with MartsManJazz3 in fine form. It was the busiest-ever Chester-bound Music Train. An excellent end to our most successful season with our highest average attendance of 39. Numbers ranged from 25 to 62, with 36 as the median. All thirteen of our planned Music Trains ran (last year we 'lost' one to the other World Cup) and were well-attended. We arranged four events for groups, including visitors from Perth (Australia).

Thanks to the bands, to the conductors who enjoyed the music and collected the fares, to the staff at the Golden Pheasant in Plumley and Alexanders in Chester, to my fellow hosts – and to you, the audiences.

The 2015 programme was sponsored by Northern, who have been very supportive since Music Trains began in 2008. Their franchise ends at the end of the year and the new franchisee is yet to be announced.

Feedback is very welcome – what did you enjoy? what could we improve? do you know of a band who could play on the Music Train? would you be willing to be the host on one of them?

More Music Trains in 2016 We plan to start again in April from Chester to Plumley and in May from Altrincham to Chester. Music Trains are arranged and hosted by members of the Mid Cheshire Rail Users Association (MCRUA) on behalf of the Mid Cheshire Community Rail Partnership. Watch the website or subscribe to this newsletter for details. We can try to arrange Music Trains for groups if the organiser is fairly confident of getting 30 people to come along. They need to be at times when the trains and venues are not too crowded – so in the evening or in the middle of the day and on weekdays rather than at weekends.

Home Security Operation Shield	Christmas Services.
<p>The Parish Council received a request from Cheshire Constabulary to work with them by offering each home owner in the parish a 'SelectaDNA' kit. This is a type of traceable liquid which is used to mark up valuable items within the home that are most frequently stolen when a burglary takes place.</p> <p>Each DNA Forensic Property Marking kit is available at a vastly reduced cost of £10. The normal cost would be over £40 and each Kit would allow between 30 and 50 items to be marked including TVs, Smartphones, Desktop PCs, Laptops, Digital Cameras, etc. The marks can be seen with an ultra violet light and can be instantly traceable to their owners through the database. More information is available from the company's website – selectadna.co.uk</p> <p>SelectaDNA kits have been supplied to high crime level areas and have achieved reductions in burglary of up to 88% nationally. Recent results in Cheshire are showing results of up to 68% in Chester. Offenders have moved away from these areas which are clearly signed as having items forensically marked and if sufficient kits are sold we would be able to have such signs – as now seen in Mobberley and Chelford – near clusters of houses.</p> <p>Police Officers and PCSO's from Cheshire Constabulary will be on hand when the kits are delivered to demonstrate their use and register them on your behalf</p>	<p>Monday 21st December 4pm Christingle service come along and have fun making your christingle then sing a few carols.
