Greenfingers

Summer weather has finally arrived! Here are a few hints and tips for your gardens:

- Trim conifers and garden hedges
- Take cuttings from tender perennials and dehead flowers to encourage new blooms
- Cut lavender for drying and trim once flowering is over (avoid cutting old wood)
- Plant Autumn bulbs
- Keep rhododendrons well watered while their buds are forming for next year
- Prune rambling roses (up to a third)
