Latest Council Snippets

At the meeting of the Council on the 6th December the following key items were discussed.

Budget 2018/19

Following a review of the draft budget it was agreed by council that the Parish Council element of the council tax would remain the same for this year.

Speedwatch -

Speedwatch volunteers have been out in force on Plumley Moor Road with over 250 recorded instances of speeding, these have been forwarded to Cheshire Police for review. The Speedwatch team are also investigating other technologies to combat this issue which is causing major concerns for residents.

Neighbourhood Planning

Many councils are looking at or are in the process of developing Neighbourhood Plans, last night the council received a second presentation from a planning consultant to examine the merits of this work. Further discussions will take place before a decision is made
