HS2 Latest news

As part of HS2 Ltd's engagement strategy a meeting was arranged with Parish Councils (PC Cluster Group) in Cheshire East who are affected by the route of HS2. A representative of Plumley with Toft and Bexton PC attended the meeting. This is to be first in a series of bi-monthly meetings which will look at the mitigation of the effects of HS2, both during construction and operation, on the parishes.

The meetings will address issues of noise and visual mitigation and of clashes with roads, footpaths and bridleways throughout the parishes and also any clashes with areas of interest. Consideration will also be given to the siting of roads and storage depots required during the construction phase of HS2.

Whilst the meeting was positive the council representatives stressed the need for HS2 Ltd. to look at the reduction of the proposed route height through Cheshire and it was agreed that this issue would be addressed at the next meeting.
