# **Speed reduction scheme for Plumley Moor Road moves closer**

As a Parish Council, we have often asked the people of the Parish for feedback about any concerns and issues which need our attention. Ranging from informal personal discussions to the consultation sessions we held when considering a neighbourhood plan, the result has always been the same. The biggest concern for most people is the speed of traffic through the village.

Over the years we have consulted with Cheshire East Highways to explore every avenue to try and resolve this issue. Sadly, we have been met with a refusal to all our suggestions. We have also tried to raise support for the Speedwatch scheme in the village. Many of us have stood by the roadside in the wet and windy weather to see first hand the disregard many drivers have for the speed limit. Ultimately there seemed to be little impact as drivers realised there was no consequence for their actions.

However, over the last couple of years we have pursued a different solution. This has been led by Councillor Steve Jones drawing on his considerable experience and understanding. Working with the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) together with the Cheshire Association of Local Councils, he devised a scheme where the introduction of average speed cameras in local villages could become a possibility. There has been a huge amount of work involved with this idea, and numerous local councils have said they would like such a scheme. But the complexity and costs involved mean that the concept needs to be tested and proved first before large numbers of this type of scheme can be considered by the PCC. So, it was decided that the best way to achieve this was go ahead with an average speed camera scheme installation in three different parishes. Although these installations will be permanent across the life of the equipment, they will serve as a trial or pilot for the justification of the wider installation of these schemes.

As you can imagine, there was huge competition across the local councils to be awarded one of these first three schemes. Even though the whole concept was created through the work of Plumley with Toft and Bexton Parish Council, we had to throw our hat into the ring in the same way as other councils wanting to be considered for one of these three schemes. However, I am delighted to be able to confirm that we have indeed been selected as the Parish within Cheshire East that will see an average speed camera scheme installed through the village.

The other two schemes will be Action Bridge in Cheshire West and Lymm in Warrington.

There is much work still to do and I can not at this stage confirm timescales. We have an agreement with the PCC, but final costings form the equipment supplier need to be confirmed and the contracts drawn up and signed. The agreement is that the police will pay for all of the running and maintenance costs of the cameras over their 15 year life. We as Parish Council have to meet the initial purchase costs of the cameras which we will do through a loan. The additional annual costs of the scheme will mean we will have to increase our precept slightly in the coming years. But we have built some reserves as we worked on the idea which will soften the impact.

There is no doubt that this type of scheme is the most efficient way of making sure drivers obey speed limits. After all the years of concern and campaigning, it is a tremendous achievement to have an effective solution in site to prevent speeding vehicles through the village. I would like to express my thanks to Steve Jones for his pioneering work and hours of time that have given us and other villages this new opportunity to make our roads safer. It is our belief that the three initial schemes will prove to be a great success in pursuit of this goal. Hopefully additional councils and villages will then be able to benefit as we will. Finally, as we move into December, I would like on behalf of the Parish Council to wish you all a very blessed and peaceful Christmas. ### **Plumley and District Probus Club**

The club continues to be active and recent talks have included "Recycling in Cheshire East" by Lisa Collas from Ansa Environmental Services who are wholly owned and controlled by Cheshire East and who empty our bins and clean the streets, amongst other things. The speaker was excellent and the talk extremely instructive, especially to members who thought they already had a good grasp of silver bin versus black bin, for example.

The most recent talk was by John Kerwin who spoke about Agincourt. John explained at the outset that he wasn't a qualified historian but you would not have known. His research had been exemplary and his command of detail was really impressive. He made the past come alive describing some of the fairly horrific events that preceded Agincourt. Henry V felt it was God's will for him to rule both England and France and put together a massive army at great expense to invade France. Dukes were paid £13 per day while the poor archers received 2d. The King's personal retinue amounted to 900 men and he had 233 horses for his own use. The invasion was badly held up at Harfleur, then a major port in north western France, these days superseded by nearby Le Havre. What should have taken two days took six weeks and cost a lot of lives. The battle of Agincourt then took place on Henry's retreat back to England and, amazingly, he secured a convincing victory over vastly superior numbers. A recent highlight for the club was winning the local Probus Golf tournament where Plumley won both the team prize and also the individual prize (Peter Ellis). Well done to the team!

Our social group was fortunate to have a tour of the vast warehousing facilities of H W Coates at Byley (through family connections) and we learnt all about the logistics of getting stuff around the country together with a fascinating history of the company's growth at the Byley site. When Coates purchased the site in the 1960s, there were still anti-aircraft guns and camouflage netting on the roof and instructions to staff as to what to do in the case of a German invasion. There was even a gun emplacement inside the factory which was used to assemble Wellington bombers during the war. Two aircraft could be built alongside each other in six days! That same building is still standing today and is still providing warehousing for the company.

We are looking forward to our six-monthly Ladies' Lunch later this month, open to members, partners and widows.

Our regular meetings are held at the Golden Pheasant in Plumley from 12 noon on the second and fourth Tuesdays in the month.
