Council updates

PLUMLEY Parish Council has previously reported they have gained support from the Police and Crime Commoners Office and local residents for the introduction of AVERAGE SPEED CAMERAS on Plumley Moor Road from the Church, leading up to and across the station bridge. The funding is n in place and the necessary borrowing approved by the Public Works Loan Board. We have been advised that the police are still in discussions with Cheshire East and the power supply provider and Cheshire East Highways with regards to temporary road closures for when the cameras are to be installed. The police still cannot give us a definitive start date but continue to say our scheme is now guaranteed and will take place as soon as these matters have been resolved.

CHESHIRE EAST COUNCIL GREEN WASTE SUBSCRIPTION SERVICE By subscribing, residents may choose to continue using their garden bin to recycle food waste. Subscriptions cost £56 per garden bin, per year, with a 25% reduction in the fee available for those receiving qualifying benefits. Once subscribed, residents will be sent a welcome pack containing their subscription sticker, which will have their address and unique subscription number on it. Residents are urged to attach the sticker to the back of their garden bin (handle side) as soon as they receive it as garden bins without a valid sticker displaying will not be emptied. Residents will only pay for the Garden Waste Recycling Scheme if they choose to opt-in and it remains free for residents to dispose of their garden waste at the borough's household waste recycling centres.

The council also continues to encourage residents to try composting at home. Residents not able to sign up online can contact the council on 0300 123 5011.

HIGHWAYS RESPONSIBILITIES

The Parish Council are quite often quite often contacted by residents about Highways issues which include the condition of the roads, pavements, lighting and signage. It is relatively simple to report any of these issues directly through to Cheshire East Council. This can be done via their website where you can report any of those issues by going onto the Cheshire East Website and search for Fixmystreet. Although we can lobby CE on behalf of our residents concerns, as a Parish Council we have no ability to alter the decisions CE make in these areas.

Cheshire East Council are also responsible for setting the speed limits on all roads which they do by following national guidelines,. These are quite often challenged by local residents and as a Parish Council we have represented those concerns especially on Middlewich Road and Plumley Moor Road. At the request of the Parish Council, Cheshire East agreed to undertake a route review approximately 7 years ago which included the aforementioned roads. The outcome was not as we wanted as it stated that the speed limits followed national guidelines and would not be changed.



Knutsford and Plumley Probus Club

Knutsford and Plumley Probus Club has spent the summer hosting a wide variety of speakers, all very interesting, and also participating in several social events. We had a talk from George Pilkington on "The Birds and the Bees" (to which our ladies were invited) which was, literally, about birds and bees and their amorous activities. We then had a doom-laden talk from Keith Stevens on "The Population Bomb — waiting to explode". The end of the world will not so much be due to a population explosion but rather a combination of increased longevity and declining male and female fertility, leading to an unsustainable ratio of old to young people. Stephen Shakeshaft gave us another of his "Chester Uncovered" talks while Keith Warrender spoke on the "Hidden Gems of Manchester", a fascinating insight into the history of odd but lesser known buildings in Greater Manchester and Cheshire.

Tony Bostock spoke about "Cheshire's Ancient Mariner", Sir George Beeston, who had a distinguished career in the Royal Navy, was MP for Cheshire, died in 1601 and is buried at Bunbury Church. He captained HMS Dreadnought against the Armada but is less well-known than many of his contemporaries. George Scargill spoke on "Lucky Hitler" and described a few of the many attempts on Hitler's life. Ian Morison spoke on "Black Holes – no need to be afraid" and, as usual, gave us a fascinating talk. Most recently, we've had David Simmons talking about "Capt. Eric 'Winkle' Brown- Britain's Greatest Pilot". Amazingly, he flew 487 different aircraft and made 2407 carrier landings. Post-war, he worked on jet plane development and then helicopters. He commanded RAF Lossiemouth and appeared on Desert Island Discs in 2014 before dying at the grand old age of 97. At our latest meeting, Isabelle Killicoat talked about the paintings in the Manchester Art Gallery.

Regrettably, we lost one of our long-standing, well-liked and respected members, Laurie Fairman in October but, on the brighter side, we have had three social events — a Ladies' Lunch, a trip to the Avro aircraft museum and an entertaining evening with David Somerville talking about his work with the National Crime Agency following his retirement from the army.
