
Plumley Toft and Bexton Parish Council Newsletter June 2025



PATTON'S 3RD US ARMY IN CHESHIRE

In 1944, U.S. General George S. Patton made Peover Hall his headquarters as he prepared for the D-Day landings

To mark the 80th anniversary of his death, a special General Patton Exhibition is being held this summer at St Lawrence's Church, Peover, just a short walk from the Hall.

Curated from the Peover Hall archives and Patton's personal diaries, the exhibition gives a fascinating insight into his time in Cheshire, his bold leadership style and his reflections ahead of the Normandy landings.

Opening Saturday 7th June during the Peover Hall NGS Open Weekend Also open daily from Sunday 9th to Saturday 14th June, 9am – 5pm Then open every Tuesday and Thursday throughout the summer, 2.30pm – 4.30pm

Come and stand where history was made, and uncover the story of one of WWII's most legendary generals in the very place he once walked.

Parish Council Review of 2024-25

Structure of the Council –Remains at full strength of 11 Councillors with the new additions of Penny Allen and Mark Pickup who joined in 2024

Cheshire East Ward Councillor – Anthony Harrison who is also a Plumley resident and proving to be very proactive on local issues

Planning Applications. A few contentious applications were reviewed by the council

- 1. The Dog exercise park, huge public outcry withdrawn
- 2. The Golden Pheasant, Big concern over road safety. withdrawn
- 3. The new development on Middlewich road, A lot of members of the public attended the planning meeting to make their views known

The Parish Council continues to challenge these types of applications to protect the community

Highways. Unfortunately there are many ongoing issues which the council continues to fight for on the basis of safety these include

- 1. General condition of roads and footpaths
- 2. Line of sight at junctions corners heights of hedges.
- 3. The station bridge Pavement width disability access
- 4. Street lighting most repairs now completed

However Cheshire East Highways visited the village early in 2025 to review our concerns, they stated there are no safety issues they view as a concern in anything we raised, and closed the case. Despite many challenges it is their decision and their responsibility now.

Average Speed Camera project. The finances are in place through a low interest loan via the Public Works Loans Board and other interest free borrowing. We are waiting for installation / power supply for camera by Pheasent. This is being dealt with by the Police and Crime Commissioners Office, Cheshire East Highways, Scottish Power and the Golden Pheasant—It's proving to be a very protracted and frustrating process

Cheadle Lane bridge over Peover Eye. It is affecting local businesses and is a huge inconvenience for drivers and pedestrians. We have invited the relevant Cheshire East Officer to a council meeting to discuss this—residents will be welcome!

Streetscape. Is a new initiative for the council aimed at improving out local environment for the benefit of residents, works to date include —

- 1. The repainting of the fingerpost on Trouthall Lane
- 2. Refurbished noticeboards
- 3. Additional planting in front of the Village Store
- 4. Bulb planting planned for the coming year with other restoration work under review

Plumley Station the council recognise and supports the work being done by volunteers with extensive planting and improved signage, this creates a fabulous gateway into the village.

The bad news is the possibility of 2 hourly service, via this newsletter we asked for comments about the proposed reduction in services—the council has received 27 complaints / concerns over these plans. These have and continue to be forwarded to our Local MP

Gardening at Plumley Station has been given a bold and celebratory refresh as part of Railway 200—a nationwide campaign marking 200 years of Modern Railways. The station now proudly displays a new sign featuring the Railway 200 logo, highlighting its role in this historic moment. Volunteers have worked tirelessly to prepare the gardens, holding regular weeding sessions and carefully planning new planting schemes.

A particular challenge has been working within the Railway 200 colour palette of red, white, and black, an unusual horticultural combination. Despite this, the team has created striking displays that are both dramatic and welcoming. Colourful bunting adds an extra festive touch, bringing the station to life for passengers and visitors.

One of the standout features is a section of rail track reused from the RHS Show garden the team built last year. Several plants left over from that project have also been replanted at Plumley, giving them a new home and reinforcing the team's commitment to sustainability.

The result is a thoughtful, creative, and community-driven celebration of both local effort and national heritage, proudly on display for all to enjoy.

As you are no doubt aware the highways network in Cheshire East is currently in a poor state and you probably feel that there is nothing you can do about it. They, like many other councils, have a system called FIX MY STREET which is on their website. It is relatively simple to use all you have to do is click on and open the link below which will take you through to their website page for Plumley and click on the Report a Problem. https://fixmystreet.cheshireeast.gov.uk/reports/, Cheshire+East There are many problems you can report such as significant potholes, street lighting not working, hedges obstructing views at junctions and damages to signage. The Issues will be reviewed by Cheshire East Council Highways Officers and then prioritised.

Knutsford and District Talking Newspaper

Do you know someone who would like to have a weekly recording of the Knutsford Guardian?

We are a voluntary group who want to bring the local news to our blind and visually impaired.

We are a voluntary group who want to bring the local news to our blind and visually impaired residents by recording articles from the local newspaper *The Knutsford Guardian*. We cover all local villages.

We try to improve things for visually impaired people in the district, so that they can keep up to date with local news. We are also happy to send the recordings to residents who may have difficulty holding a newspaper or struggle to process when reading print (maybe as a result of a stroke or other neurological / physical disability)

We record the news and articles each week and then copy the recording onto a memory stick and post it out weekly to our listeners. This is a completely free service and all listeners also receive a USB Player specifically designed for the visually impaired, free of charge.

Our weekly recordings are also available for free on the Talking Newspaper App (Android & iOS) or via Devices such as Amazon Alexa or Amazon Echo. If you know of anyone who may benefit as a listener or if you would be interested in volunteering and need any further information, please contact
